I recently came across the story of Jonah in my scripture reading and thought that there were some parallels to how we may feel as quarantine drags on.

Jonah is known as the prophet who was running away from God and ended up getting swallowed up by a big fish. I'm fascinated by where Jonah was choosing to run away to, Tarshish, a far off and more ideal place than the land of Nineveh where God wanted him to go. Tarshish was like sunshine and palm trees while Nineveh was a dark place known for its violence. Jonah could have lived comfortably in Tarshish, continuing to do what he always had done religiously without ever having to deal with God or reality. I can't say I blame Jonah, I'd much rather be comfortable and simply not care about certain people. If we're honest, most of us prefer Tarshish over Nineveh and we can run away from God and his purposes for us. It is not until storms enter in our lives and we find ourselves at a loss of control over our lives and destinies when we begin to wrestle with God. Perhaps, we may need to get away from the life we know with all of its activity and entanglements and the lies and pressures that constantly confront us in order to find a foothold in Christ so that we live the life that God desires for us to have.

Either way, our greatest challenge is finding our breath and life in Christ especially in our efforts to serve God or when things are less than ideal. The reality is that we reside in places like Nineveh or we've substituted a relationship with God with the comforts of Tarshish — we need a savior. Our hearts are dark and still in need of rescuing everyday. God dwells with us wherever we are. While we may want to escape from the discomfort, loss, pain, and grief that is very real in our lives especially during Covid, God is calling us to communion with him with all honestly about where we are. I know many of us want to run away, we want change, we want relief. I do

We have seen through recent chapters in our journey through Exodus that it is better to turn to God than turn from him. Some of our Community Groups are studying the New Testament letter of James and we can see that the gospel is found in turning to him in humility rather than to ourselves in pride. The season of Lent reminds us that spring is upon us and new life is ready to emerge. The hope of the resurrection on Easter Sunday reminds us that one day, that new life will be made complete. Until then, his spirit dwells in us by faith working powerfully to transform us. God may be trying to get our attention right now so that he can do his best work in us and through us. It may take a storm. It may feel like we're trapped in the belly of a big fish. It's there we realize, where can we go from his spirit? Where can we run from his presence? This season of Lent in this lockdown invites us to see that we can only do so much and we're not as great as we think we are. We still need rescuing and refuge in Christ. Therefore, deepen and establish what may be shallow roots right now in his unrelenting love for you daily. Jesus tells us that it is when we abide in him, especially in all of the chaos, disappointments and failures of a season like this, that new life is breaking through. It's happening.

I pray that all the resources that are available, our time in the book of Exodus, gathering together in community groups and other times would encourage you towards a more honest and spiritually rich Lenten Season.

The Church is the body of Christ, and as such is not designed to be aligned with our personal likes or dislikes. Instead, we are challenged to grow beyond our own preferences to help raise up the body of Christ together. I am glad that even though most of my time at C4 has been virtual, I have connected with a community of brothers and sisters that I know will always encourage and edify one another, even in the most challenging of circumstances.

# **CENTER UPDATE**

Hey Friends,

It's been a year since the Covid pandemic has changed our "normal." Here's a recap of the efforts to bring shalom into the community through our Center.

The Playground was renovated April-November 2020 In November we hosted the Presidential Elections polling station and had about 270 vote, as most voters sent in their ballots. Carol Gung led a team to administer 84 flu shots to the community.

We served at On Lok Community Center to distribute 100 blankets (12/22) and New Years Goodie bags (2/11). We picked up 100,000 donated masks to be distributed to local organizations (2/26)

## Learn Support Program (at McCall School) IMMEDIATE NEED FOR VOLUNTEERS

We have coordinated with Chinatown's public elementary school to provide classrooms with tutors. Currently 10 teachers have requested tutors and we have only 6 people committed to help at least 1 hour a week with reading, writing and arithmetic. We have opportunity for at least 4 more volunteers to assist the teachers. This program begins March 8 and continues through Memorial Day. Security clearances and waivers need to be completed.
